# **Crochet Moss Stitch Stocking Pattern**

# Pattern Notes:

Available in 2 sizes. Mini stocking = 12" high & 6" wide or Full size stocking = 18"high & 9"wide

# Materials Needed:

- 5mm crochet hook
- Craft smart value yarn (1 skein)
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker

# Terms Used:

- Ch = chain
- Sc = single crochet
- Sl.st = slip stitch
- Hdc = half double crochet

- Dc = double crochet
- Hdc.dec = half double crochet decrease

Pattern: mini stocking instructions are first, full size stocking instructions are below

# **MINI SIZE STOCKING PATTERN:**

Note: You will begin with the toe so although my stocking is one solid colour, if you plan to make yours with different colour for the toe, heel and cuff you will start with that colour first

### **ROUND 1:**

- Magic ring, ch.1
- Hdc 8 times into the magic ring, pull closed and close round with a sl.st into the ch.1 space

## **ROUND 2:**

• Ch.1, hdc twice into each stitch around, close with sl.st (16)

### **ROUND 3:**

• Ch.1, hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into the following stitch .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (24)

# **ROUND 4:**

• Ch.1, hdc once into each of the first 2 stitches, hdc twice into the following stitch .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (32)

### **ROUND 5:**

• Ch.1, hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the following 3 stitches .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (40)

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where the toe ends so you will now switch to your main colour

#### **ROUND 6:**

- Ch.1 & turn work so you're going back around the other direction; as the rounds build up you'll notice your work is inside out; this is how it's supposed to be
- Hdc in the first stitch, sl.st in the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1 (40)

### **ROUND 7:**

• Sl.st into the first stitch, hdc into the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 8:**

• Hdc into the first stitch, sl.st into the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 9-18:**

Repeat round 7 & 8 alternating in order

#### HEEL:

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where you will work the heel, so you can switch now

- Hdc once into each of the first 20 stitches
- Ch.1 & turn work
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 16 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (18)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 14 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (16)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 12 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (14)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 10 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (12)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 8 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (10)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 8 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (12)

- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 10 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (14)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 12 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (16)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 14 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (18)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 16 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (20)
- Folding the piece you just worked (the heel) forward over itself lining up the edges, close the sides with sl.st all the way down one side you're on right now, ch.1 & fasten off
- Re-attach yarn on the other side and close that edge with sl.st all the way down, ch.1 & fasten off
- you should now see a round opening

# **ROUND 19:**

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where you will work rest of the main body of the stocking, so you can switch now to that colour

- Re-attach yarn wherever you would like (I generally pick one of the inner connecting corners from the heel) & ch.1
- Hdc in first stitch, sl.st in the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 20:**

• Sl.st into the first stitch, hdc into the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

# **ROUND 21:**

 Hdc into the first sttich, sl.st into the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 22-41:**

Repeat 20 & 21 alternating in order

### **ROUND 42:**

Note: here is where you will be working on the cuff, so if you're using 2 different colours you'll want to change colours now

• Ch.2, dc into each stitch around, close with sl.st in the top of the ch.2 space

### **ROUND 43 - 47:**

Ch.1, hdc into each stitch around, close with sl.st

# **FINISHING:**

- Fasten off, use yarn needle to hide all tail ends in and out of the stitches
- Your work is inside out right now, flip around so it's no longer inside out
- Fold cuff down and re-attach yarn at the back of the folded cuff where you will want the loop for hanging your stocking
- Ch.10, sl.st into the same stitch you attached to
- Fasten off and hide tail ends by weaving in and out of the stitches on the inside of the stocking

# **FULL SIZE STOCKING PATTERN:**

Note: You will begin with the toe so although my stocking is one solid colour, if you plan to make yours with different colour for the toe, heel and cuff you will start with that colour first

### **ROUND 1:**

- Magic ring, ch.1
- Hdc 8 times into the magic ring, pull closed and close round with a sl.st into the ch.1 space

# **ROUND 2:**

Ch.1, hdc twice into each stitch around, close with sl.st (16)

### **ROUND 3:**

Ch.1, hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into the following stitch ....
continue all the way around, close with sl.st (24)

### **ROUND 4:**

 Ch.1, hdc once into each of the first 2 stitches, hdc twice into the following stitch .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (32)

### **ROUND 5:**

• Ch.1, hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the following 3 stitches .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (40)

# **ROUND 6:**

• Ch.1, hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the following 4 stitches .... continue all the way around, close with sl.st (48)

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where the toe ends so you will now switch to your main colour

# **ROUND 7:**

- Ch.1 & turn work so you're going back around the other direction; as the rounds build up you'll notice your work is inside out; this is how it's supposed to be
- Hdc in the first stitch, sl.st in the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1 (48)

### **ROUND 8:**

• Sl.st into the first stitch, hdc into the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 9:**

 Hdc into the first stitch, sl.st into the next .... continue alternating between these 2 stitches all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

# **ROUND 10 – 28:**

Repeat round 8 & 9 alternating in order

#### HEEL:

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where you will work the heel, so you can switch now

- Hdc once into each of the first 20 stitches
- Ch.1 & turn work
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 16 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (18)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 14 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (16)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 12 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (14)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 10 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (12)
- Hdc.dec, hdc once into each of the next 8 stitches, hdc.dec, ch.1 & turn work (10)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 8 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (12)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 10 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (14)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 12 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (16)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 14 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (18)
- Hdc twice into the first stitch, hdc once into each of the next 16 stitches, hdc twice into the last stitch, ch.1 & turn work (20)
- Folding the piece you just worked (the heel) forward over itself lining up the edges, close the sides with sl.st all the way down one side you're on right now, ch.1 & fasten off
- Re-attach yarn on the other side and close that edge with sl.st all the way down, ch.1 & fasten off
- you should now see a round opening

### **ROUND 29:**

Note: if you're using 2 colours, here is where you will work rest of the main body of the stocking, so you can switch now to that colour

- Re-attach yarn wherever you would like (I generally pick one of the inner connecting corners from the heel) & ch.1
- Hdc in first stitch, sl.st in the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

#### **ROUND 30:**

 Sl.st into the first stitch, hdc into the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 31:**

 Hdc into the first sttich, sl.st into the next .... continue alternating all the way around, close with sl.st & ch.1

### **ROUND 32-51:**

Repeat 30 & 31 alternating in order

### **ROUND 52:**

Note: here is where you will be working on the cuff, so if you're using 2 different colours you'll want to change colours now

• Ch.2, dc into each stitch around, close with sl.st in the top of the ch.2 space

### **ROUND 53 - 63:**

Ch.1, hdc into each stitch around, close with sl.st

### **FINISHING:**

- Fasten off, use yarn needle to hide all tail ends in and out of the stitches
- Your work is inside out right now, flip around so it's no longer inside out
- Fold cuff down and re-attach yarn at the back of the folded cuff where you will want the loop for hanging your stocking
- Ch.10, sl.st into the same stitch you attached to
- Fasten off and hide tail ends by weaving in and out of the stitches on the inside of the stocking
